With great sadness we announce the passing of David Pinchuk of Lake Worth, FL, on June 26th, 2020 at the age of 87 in the Cleveland Clinic Florida, in Weston. David was born in Brooklyn, NY and attended Tilden High School. He joined the U.S. Air Force and served for four years during the Korean War and was Honorably Discharged from active duty.
